A Message from the Founder

Happy Anniversary to Studio 84!

Ten years ago, Studio 84 came to life. Opening its doors to the community it grew to be a unique local treasure that the community has embraced and for that I am thankful. In June of 2018 we kicked off our ten-year anniversary with our annual Gala Night with a packed house of artists and supporters. As we come to a half way point in our ten-year celebration, I see a major transition coming our way.

In fact, the transition has been happening for most of this tenth year:

- Our group of students have grown to the point of needing to hire more staff. At the time of this writing we have over 30 students enrolled, with them averaging 35 hrs per week of art making.
- We have a great high school transition program developing with local school districts.
- Our Art as a Career program has three very strong artists selling their work, with websites and lots of opportunities to sell their work other than just our store. All complete with business cards and websites.
- Sales of all art has increased 28% since 2017!
- Our board of directors has doubled in size and is working hard to develop fundraisers to support this growth.

There is no doubt that this tenth year has been a year of tremendous growth and we welcome even more growth as we TRANSITION into our next ten years.

The biggest transition is developing the Studio to be sustainable for the future. As some of you may know, I am looking at my future of retirement and as the founder, this is the single most important thing on my to do list...not retirement...but the Studio's sustainability. We currently have funding from one donor whose company matches that donation...this number is equal 30% of our current budget. This donor is also looking at a near future of retirement and when this happens much of this funding is retired also.

My task as the founder and director is to develop a board that will assist with this task of increasing our funding sources that will replace that funding throughout the next several years. It is crucial to the sustainability and future of the Studio.

This transition will require a team effort.

I hope that our supporters will continue to be involved with that team.


